Director's Report - Project Updates

Union Hill/Longacre Signals

At the time of this report the signalization project is essentially complete. Today the contractor is installing the pavement marking and will likely finish tomorrow. The signal lights are scheduled to be turned on Thursday, September 3 and will be fully functional on that date.

Hollandia Sanitary and Storm Drainage Improvements

The Hollandia project is now complete as the trash rack was installed last week. The rack will be monitored for trash and debris collection on a routine basis subsequent to rainfall events.



Old Collinsville Road Right Turn Lane at Ashland Avenue

This project is a proposed joint effort between St. Clair County and the City of Fairview Heights for which an Intergovernmental Agreement has yet to be executed. St. Clair County has recently submitted a draft agreement to this office which will be presented at the July Public Works Committee meeting.

The proposed Agreement between the City and the County will be presented at a Public Works Committee meeting subsequent to the meeting that holds discussions on the budget reassess.

Single Source Trash Hauling – Aspen Waste

Through an update provided by Aspen Waste last week the implementation of the single source hauling is still on schedule for October as they have taken delivery of one truck with the other two due to be delivered soon. Aspen will be sending correspondence to the residents sometime in the next week requesting feedback on which type of service option they would like and whether they qualify for senior or disability discounts.

The Aspen Waste customer base has been continually growing as Top Notch and Republic have stopped servicing Fairview Heights and Waste Management halting service at the end of September.

MFT Maintenance Resolution

Staff is in the process of preparing a third Resolution requesting authorization of funds specific to snow and ice control this winter, in particular salaries. As soon as the Resolution request figure is determined it will go to Committee and Council for action.
